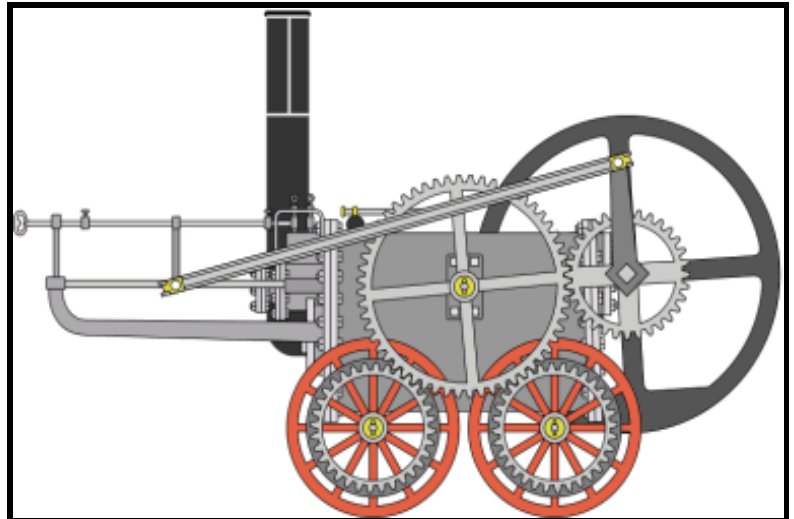


Richard Trevithick built the first working railway steam locomotive in 1802.

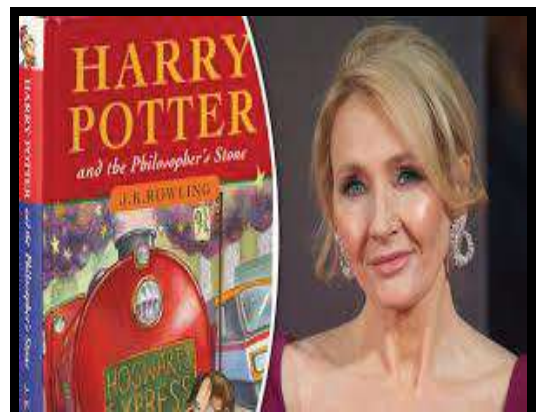

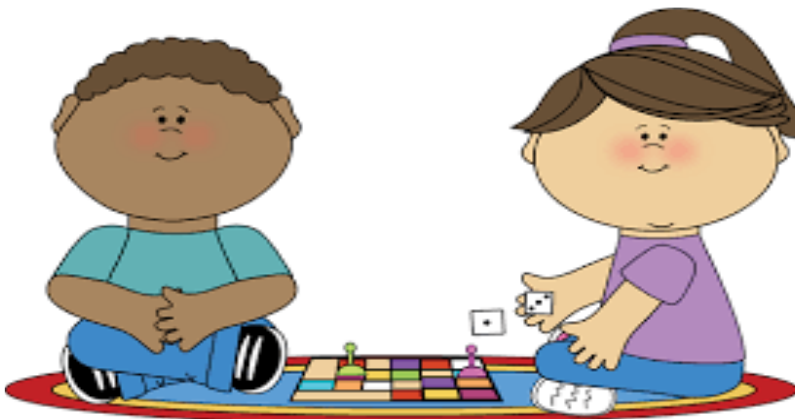
